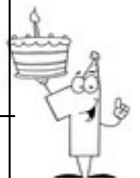

<p><u>Monday</u> <i>Intercession of Saints</i></p> <p>Lord, may the medals we wear be constant reminders of the lives they depict. While wearing them, may we be blessed through the saints' intercession and protected from harm. Help us to continue to spread the messages of Jesus and Mary and the saints and angels.</p>	<p><u>Tuesday</u> <i>Pray the Rosary</i></p> <p>Lord, your mother gave us the rosary to save us from the evil world. Help us to spread her devotion. Help us to honor her request that we pray the rosary. Help us meditate on your life and the grace of salvation you bring us.</p>	<p><u>Wednesday</u> <i>Oneness with Jesus</i></p> <p>It is through the Eucharist that Jesus gives us his Body to eat and his Blood to drink, so that we can dwell in him and he in us. Jesus came to lead us into oneness with him and to help us live a life of oneness with others.</p>	<p><u>Thursday</u> <i>Enter the Kingdom</i></p> <p>At the end of time, the King will say to those who were compassionate toward the hungry and thirsty, the naked and the strangers: "Come, O blessed of my Father, enter the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world, even if you have never known me, because whatever you have done to the least of my brothers, you have done to me."</p>	<p><u>Friday</u> <i>Covenant of Love</i></p> <p>Jesus comes through something tiny, a little piece of bread, consecrated by the priest, which becomes his Body. This is the plan of Jesus. He will leave us physically, but through the bread he will be really present with us. The sacrament becomes a real presence for each one of us; it is not just a moment of grace but a sign of a covenant of love, a friendship offered to us.</p>	<p><u>Saturday</u> <i>Be a Missionary</i></p> <p>Jesus has chosen us to live his mission. He wants our hearts to be wellsprings of living water, loving people and helping them achieve their goals. Thus, when we announce the Good News to the poor, it is not to tell them, "Jesus loves you," but rather to say, "I love you. I commit myself to you in the name of Jesus."</p>	<p><u>Sunday</u> <i>Call to Holiness</i></p> <p>In family, we do not love people in the abstract; love takes place in real time. It is more like the virtue of hospitality practiced by Dorothy Day: welcoming in persons off the streets, the homeless, the poor, and the hungry. The call to holiness—and the call to justice—isn't about shunning the world, but about loving the world.</p>

Saints of the Week

Mon., July 6: Saint Maria Goretti, Virgin, Martyr: d. 1902 at age twelve; born near Ancona; she was stabbed to death, preferring to die than to be raped; with her mother present, she was canonized in 1950 before the largest crowd ever assembled at that time in Rome for a canonization; patroness of teenage girls.

Thurs., July 9: Saint Augustine Zhao Rong, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs: The 120 martyrs honored today died between 1648 and 1930. Most of them (eighty-seven) were born in China and were children, parents, catechists, or laborers, ranging from nine years of age to seventy-two. This echists, or laborers, ranging from nine years of age to seventy-two. This group included four Chinese priests. The thirty-three foreign-born martyrs were mostly priests or women religious, especially from the Order of Preachers (including St. Francis Capillas, d. 15 Jan. 1648, protomartyr of China), the Paris Foreign Mission Society, the Friars Minor, Jesuits, Salesians, and Franciscan Missionaries of Mary. Augustine Zhao Rong was a Chinese soldier who accompanied the prisoner to his martyrdom in Beijing. Moved by the bishop's courage, Augustine sought baptism and not long after was ordained a diocesan priest. He was martyred in 1815. Beatified in groups at various times, these 120 martyrs were canonized 1 October 2000 by Pope John Paul II.

Sat., July 11: Saint Benedict, Abbot: d. 547; wrote famous monastic Rule noted for its wisdom and moderation and need for obedience; "Let all follow the Rule as their guide in everything, and let no one rashly depart from it" (Rule, Chapter 3); founded twelve monasteries including Monte Cassino; Benedictines today number some 7,500 religious; considered the "Patriarch of Western Monasticism"; a pa-

St. Peter Thomas was born in France and became a Carmelite while a young man. He was appointed to the Papal diplomatic service and was a legate to Genoa, Milan and Venice.

He was also appointed as the Patriarch of Constantinople in 1634.

He traveled to Serbia, Constantinople and Hungary to organize a Crusade against the Turks.

He was severely wounded in Egypt and eventually died from his wounds.
